

#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

As a result of measures recently introduced with regard to the issue of Certificates of Incorporation to socio-cultural and voluntary organisations under the Companies and Allied Matters Act No. 1 of 1990, Part C, an organisation applying for registration shall henceforth comply with the additional requirements set out below:-

Public Notice (a) It is now the responsibility of organisations to issue public notices in at least three national newspapers as to it's intention to apply for registration under the Companies and Allied Matters Act No. 1 of 1990, Part C. - (c) There should also be three publications of claim of ownership of a landed property by the organisation. The publication must be detailed enough to include the plan number and the survey beacons as well as clear description of the location of such landed property.

  (d) Each of the publications in (a) and (c) above should call for objections, if any; which must be forwarded to the Registratar-General, Corporate Affairs Commission, P.M.B. 198, Wuse Zone 5, Abuja within 28 days of the date of the publication.

- 2. Appointment of Trustees:- Appointment of Trustees should always be in accordance with the provision of Constitution of the Organisation. In forwarding the extract of the minutes of the meeting in which the trustees were elected Ericlosure H (a), it is imperative to include:

  - (i) the list of members present, and those who were absent at the incetting; and
    (ii) figure of votes scored by each elegted trustees (i.e. Votes for, against and abstentions).
- 3. Affiliated Bodies:- Details of curent and past affiliated organisation (if any) as required in Enclosure H (c) should be furnished. Information as to the type of relationship (e.g. A branch), should also be given.
- 4. Change of Name: When registered organisations decide to change their names the following procedures must be followed:

  (iv) Thereafter the organisation will formally apply to this Commission for the change of name by forwarding a copy of each of the notices.






