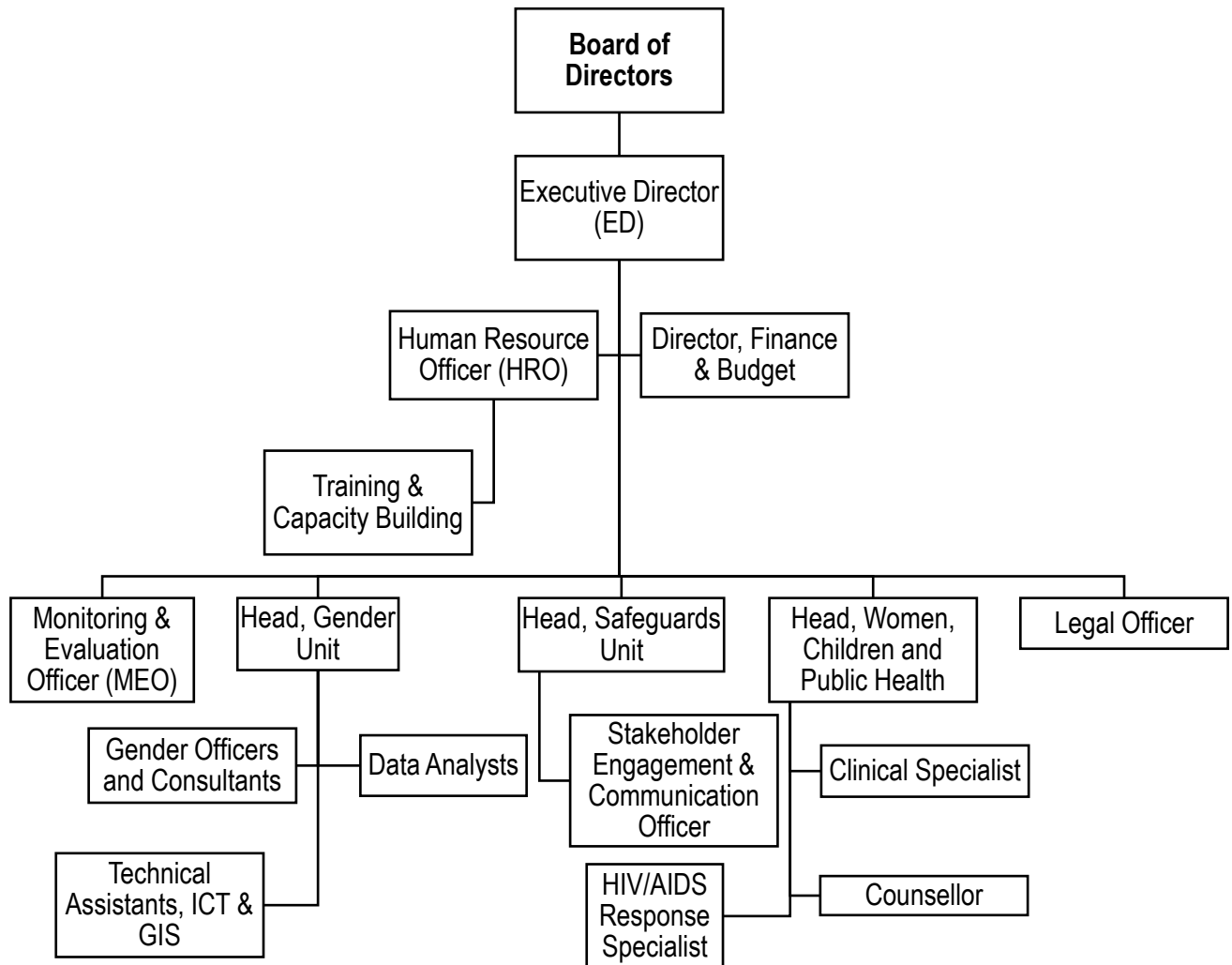

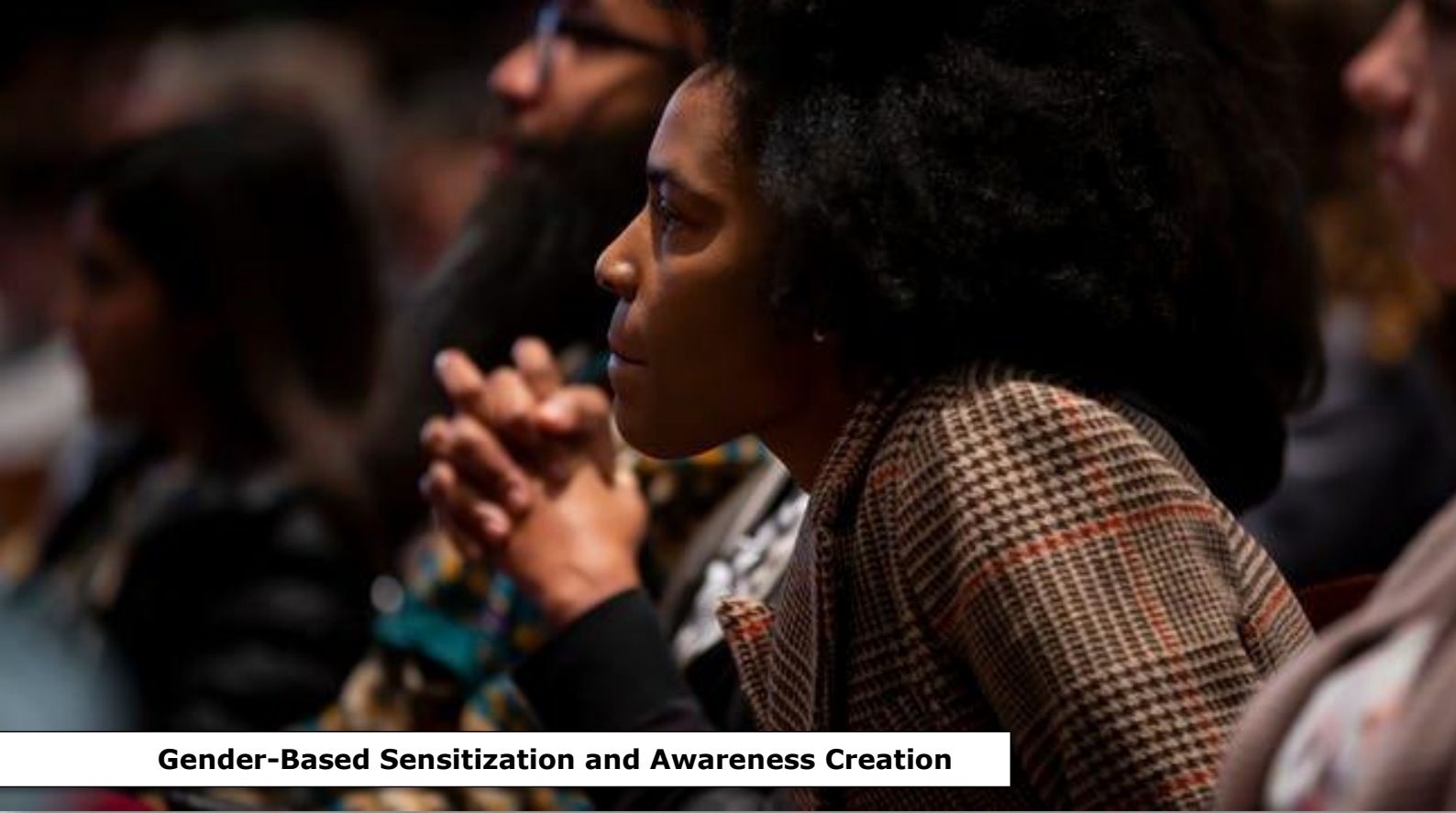

COMPANIES & ALLIED MATTERS ACT No. 1 OF 1990, PART C

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

As a result of measures recently introduced with regard to the issue of Certificates of Incorporation to socio-cultural and voluntary organisations under the Companies and Allied Matters Act No. 1 of 1990, Part C, an organisation applying for registration shall henceforth comply with the additional requirements set out below:-

1. **Public Notice** - (a) It is now the responsibility of organisations to issue public notices in at least three national newspapers as to its intention to apply for registration under the Companies and Allied Matters Act No. 1 of 1990, Part C. One of the newspapers should be Daily Times, The Punch, or New Nigerian. Whilst one should be a local newspaper widely circulated in the area where the organisation is based. However, it is advisable for organisations to check for the acceptability of their chosen name before commencing action on their registration.

(b) The publications which should include the names of the Trustees, must also indicate the area of the country where the organisation is based.

(c) There should also be three publications of claim of ownership of a landed property by the organisation. The publication must be detailed enough to include the plan number and the survey beacons as well as clear description of the location of such landed property.

(d) Each of the publications in (a) and (c) above should call for objections, if any; which must be forwarded to the Registrar-General, Corporate Affairs Commission, P.M.B. 198, Wuse Zone 5, Abuja within 28 days of the date of the publication.

2. **Appointment of Trustees**:- Appointment of Trustees should always be in accordance with the provision of Constitution of the Organisation. In forwarding the extract of the minutes of the meeting in which the trustees were elected Enclosure II (a), it is imperative to include:

- (i) the list of members present, and those who were absent at the meeting; and
- (ii) figure of votes scored by each elected trustees (i.e. Votes for, against and abstentions).

3. **Affiliated Bodies**:- Details of current and past affiliated organisation (if any) as required in Enclosure H (c) should be furnished. Information as to the type of relationship (e.g. A branch), should also be given.

4. **Change of Name**:- When registered organisations decide to change their names the following procedures must be followed:

(i) The organisation must make publication in three national newspapers as specified in paragraph 1 above.

(ii) The organisation must display for at least 21 days a notice conspicuously mounted at the organisation's headquarters and, if any, at branch offices or any such places where majority of the members are likely to see it.

(iii) The publications and notice must call for objections which (if any), must be forwarded to the Registrar-General Corporate Affairs Commission, P.M.B. 198 Wuse Zone 5, Abuja within 28 days of the date of publication.

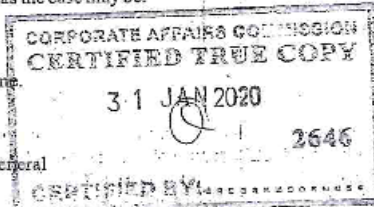
(iv) Thereafter the organisation will formally apply to this Commission for the change of name by forwarding a copy of each of the notices.

5. **Replacement and Appointment of Additional Trustees**:- When a registered organisation (a) intends to replace some or all of the members of the trustees for any reason whatsoever or in compliance with the conditions stipulated in their constitution, (b) intends to appoint additional Trustee(s), it should, in addition to the procedures stipulated in paragraph 2 above, also publish in two national newspapers the reason(s) for the desired change as well as the names of the new or additional trustees as the case may be.

6. The completed application forms must be forwarded in triplicate.

7. Please note that the collection of an application form is not an acceptance of name.



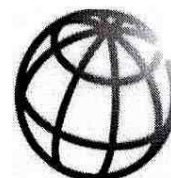



7.4: If the agency believes that the AWDF is failing to fulfil its obligations, this should be conveyed immediately to the Programme Officer who will investigate and respond promptly to the organisation.

7.5: Subject to earlier termination in accordance with the above, this funding agreement will be terminated once a satisfactory final report and set of accounts has been received. The organisation will be notified that the grant has now been formally closed and the funding agreement terminated.

8. Remedial Actions and Sanctions

When a grant requirement is breached, AWDF will endeavor to engage the grantee in order to understand the challenges leading to the breach. - 8.2. Temporary suspension of the grant while further investigations are conducted
- 8.3. Canceling or revising project activities for projects affected by non-compliance
- 8.4. Change the method of payment from advance to reimbursement;
- 8.5. Require the grantee to refund the grant amounts found to be ineligible
- 8.6. Reduce or terminate the remaining grant
- 8.7. Impose special conditions on a future grant
- 8.8. Take other legally available remedies as relevant and appropriate

AWDF has a zero tolerance approach to fraud and corruption. Where breaches in grant requirements are related to fraud or corruption, AWDF will move immediately to take legal and/or punitive measures.

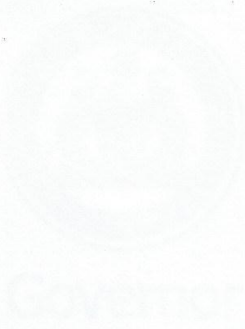

- 3) Up to 1,287,300 naira (20%) upon completion of the project and upon the review and approval of all final narrative and financial reports though July 31, 2018.

The Recipient agrees to refund to NDI any unspent funds and funds not spent in accordance






